AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, CONTAINING A PREAMBLE; AMENDING SECTION 71.50 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCE OF SAID CITY, WHICH DESIGNATES FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTIONS, TO ADD THERETO, AS AN ADDITIONAL FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION, AT WHICH VEHICULAR TRAFFIC ON DESIGNATED STREETS SHALL STOP IN THE MANNER REQUIRED BY THE TRANSPORTATION CODE, THE INTERSECTION OF NORTH AVENUE D AND OLD RIVER STREET; AMENDING SECTION 71.51 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REMOVE SUCH INTERSECTION AS TWO-WAY INTERSECTION; PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION, BY OR AT THE DIRECTION OF THE CITY MANAGER OF SAID CITY, OF THE STOP SIGNS AUTHORIZED BY THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING THAT ANY VIOLATION OF SAID CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED BY THIS ORDINANCE, SHALL BE A MISDEMEANOR AND UPON CONVICTION PUNISHED BY A FINE NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS AND THAT EACH AND EVERY DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION OCCURS AND EACH DAY OR PORTION THEREOF ON WHICH ANY SUCH VIOLATION CONTINUES SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE; CONTAINING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; CONTAINING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED TWICE IN THE BRAZOSPORT FACTS.

WHEREAS, Item (8) of Subsection (a) of Section 542.202 of the Transportation Code authorizes a municipality, as a local authority, with respect to streets and highways under their jurisdiction, to designate stop intersections; and,

WHEREAS, Subsection (b) of Section 542.203 of said Code provides that no ordinance enacted under said Section 542.202 that designates a stop intersection shall be effective until signs giving notice thereof are posted; and,

WHEREAS, Subsection (b) of Section 544.003 of said Code authorizes a municipality, as a local authority, to designate a highway or an intersection under its jurisdiction as a through highway or a stop intersection and place a stop sign at specified entrances thereto; and,

WHEREAS, Subsection (b) of Section 544.002 of said Code and Subsection (c) of Section 544.003 of said Code provide, respectively, that all traffic-control devices and all stop signs placed by a local authority must conform to the manual and specifications adopted by the Texas Department of Transportation under Section 544.001 of said Code; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Freeport, Texas, has determined and does here now declare that the adoption of this ordinance is necessary to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of said City and the

members of the general public traveling upon the streets herein below named.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS:

First, Section 71.50 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to add thereto the following intersection as a four-way stop intersection:

North Avenue D and Old River Street"

making it a four-way stop intersection; and Section 71.51 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to delete said intersection as a two-way intersection.

Second, appropriate signs giving notice of the regulations adopted by this ordinance shall be posted by or at the direction of the City Manager as may be most appropriate conforming to the Texas Department of Transportation manual and specifications.

Third, any person violating the Code of Ordinances of the City of Freeport, Texas, as amended by this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefore assessed a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars; and each and every day any such violation occurs and each day or portion of each day any such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Fourth, no offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Fifth, in the event any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Sixth, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Re: ICC Code Adoptions

Dear Jeff Pynes:

The City of Freeport was recently audited by the Insurance Service Office(ISO). The Building Code Effectiveness Grading Schedule(BCEGS) evaluates several factors in the enforcement of building and life safety codes. The City scored well in several areas but received lower scores for not having the latest building codes adopted. The ISO rating program does not recognize an adopted code if it is not within three years of the most recent published codes.

In order for the City of Freeport to maintain a good BCEG score it is recommended that the City adopt the latest edition of the International Codes. The current adopted codes are the 2009 International Residential Code, International Building Code and associated Plumbing, Mechanical, Gas, Energy, and Property Maintenance Codes. The 2011 National Electrical Codes is also currently adopted.

It is recommended that the following codes be adopted: 2015 International Building Code(IBC), International Residential Code(IRC), 2015 International Fire Code(IFC), 2015 International Energy Conservation Code(IECC), 2015 International Plumbing Code(IPC), 2015 Existing Building Code(IEBC), 2015 International Property Maintenance Code(IPMC), 2015 International Mechanical Code(IMC), 2015 International Fuel Gas Code(IFGC), 2015 International Swimming Pool and Spa Code(ISPSC), 2014 National Electrical Code(NEC), NFPA 101 Life Safety Code, including all appendices in each of the codes.

Once these codes are adopted by the City of Freeport we will be able to contact the Insurance Services Office(ISO) to let them know that we have updated the required codes to complete the audit with improved scores.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas ("the City"), is a "Home Rule City" and a "Home Rule Municipality" lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, as described in and defined by Section 5, Article XI of the Constitution of Texas and Section 1.005 of the Local Government Code, respectively; and,

Sixth, Section 150.045 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Plumbing Code, 2015 Edition" for "International Plumbing Code, 2009 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; any section reference in Sections 150.046 and 150.047 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former; and any amendments to the "International Building Code, 2015 Edition" are hereby adopted; and any amendments to the "International Plumbing Code, 2015 Edition" are hereby adopted.

Tenth, Chapter 150 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended add thereto the following section:

"Section 150.80 Life Safety Code

The NFPA 101 Life Safety Code, 2015 Edition, together with the appendices, and all amendments thereto, are hereby adopted and shall apply to all repairs, alterations, renovations and maintenance of commercial buildings and appurtances thereto. A copy of said code shall be maintained in the office of the City Secretary."

Eleventh, Section 150.100 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Energy Conservation Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Energy Conservation Code, 2003 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; any section references in Sections 150.101 or 150.102 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former; and any amendments to the "International Energy Conservation Code, 2015 Edition" are hereby adopted.

Twelfth, Section 151.01 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Electrical Code, 2014 Edition" for "International Electrical Code, 2008 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; any section references in Sections 151.02 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former; and any amendments to the "International Electrical Code, 2014 Edition" are hereby adopted.

Thirteenth, any person violating the Code of Ordinances of the City, as amended by this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefore assessed a fine as prescribed in Section 10.99 of said Code; and each day such violation occurs and each part of any day any such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

Fourteenth, nothing contained in this ordinance shall cause any rights heretofore vested to be altered, affected or impaired in any way and all such rights may be hereafter enforced as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Fifteenth, this ordinance is cumulative of and in addition to all other ordinances of the City on the same subject and all such ordinances are hereby expressly saved from repeal. Provided, however, where the provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this Ordinance conflict with the Standard Unsafe Building Abatement Code, 1985, adopted by Section 150.025 of the Code of Ordinances of the City, or the local amendments thereto contained in Section 150.026 of said Code of Ordinances, the provisions of said Standard Unsafe Building Abatement Code and said amendments thereto shall prevail. Provided further, where the provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this ordinance conflicts with the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City and any amendments thereto, the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance or amendments thereto shall prevail; but where the provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this ordinance and any other ordinance of the City conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent regulations or penalties, as the case may be, shall prevail.

Sixteenth, in the event any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Seventeenth, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its descriptive caption has been published twice in the Brazosport Facts.

All fulltime employees of the City of Freeport, along with the vast majority of cities in Texas, are covered under the Texas Municipal Retirement System (TMRS). The retirement plan is funded by 7% of employee salary contribution, 14% of the City matching funds and coupled with account interest earned on a yearly basis. Statutorily, there is an established maximum contribution rate limit, which is 14%.

TMRS is asking for approval to remove the statutory rate to allow the fund liability actuarial to regain equitable amortization tolerances of the plan unfunded liability actuarial. Although we will be suspending maximum rate, the actual multiplier rate will stabilize once the interest and value multipliers regain fund tolerance levels. Stabilization is expected within the next five years.

The proposed rate increase is already reflected in the 2016-2017 budget. Passage of this initiative will not affect our ability to maintain budget allocations nor will they require a budget adjustment.

Failure to authorize the recommended established maximum contribution rate will cause our unfunded actuarial liability to rise and will affect the past and current retiree employee benefits.

Staff and management recommend approval of the proposed TMRS ordinance to continue the quality retirement benefits for our employees.

AN ODINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, CONTAINING A PREAMBLE; AMENDING PORTIONS OF SECTIONS 94.01, 94.02, 94.03 ASND 94.06 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCE OF SAID CITY TO CONFORM THE SAME TO THE APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE JUNK VEHICLE LAW NOW CONTAINED IN SUBCHAPTER E OF CHAPTER 683 OF THE TEXAS TRANSPORTATION CODE; PROVIDING THAT ANY PERSON VIOLATING SAID CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED BY THIS ORDINANCE, SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ASSESSED A FINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 10.99 OF SAID CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING THAT EACH DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION OCCURS AND EACH PART OF ANY DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION OCCURS SHALL CONTINUE SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE; CONTAINING SAVINGS CLAUSES; CONTAINING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED TWICE IN THE BRAZOSPORT FACTS.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas, is a "Home Rule City" and a "Home Rule Municipality" lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, as described in and defined by Section 5, Article XI of the Constitution of Texas and Section 1.005 of the Local Government Code of Texas, respectively; and,

WHEREAS, Sections 51.072, 54.001, 54.004 and 217.042 of the Local Government Code, Section 683.074 of the Transportation Code and Section 2.01, 2.02 and Item (u) of Section 3.07 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Freeport authorize the City Council thereof to adopt the provisions of this Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Freeport has determined to and does here now declare that the adoption of this ordinance is necessary to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of said City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS:

First, the following definitions now appearing in Section 94.01 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Freeport, Texas, are hereby amended to read and the following definitions not now appearing in Section 94.01 of said Code are hereby added, each to read as follows:

"All terms used in this chapter, unless specifically defined otherwise, shall have the meanings ascribed to them by the Texas Transportation Code. The following terms are specifically defined

ANTIQUE VEHICLE means a passenger car, truck, or motorcycle that:

- (a) Is at least twenty-five (25) years old;
- (b) Is a collector's item;
- (c) Is used exclusively for exhibitions, club activities, parades, and other functions of public interest;
- (d) Is not used for regular transportation; and
- (e) Does not carry advertising.

CLASSIC VEHICLE means a motor vehicle that is at least twenty-five (25) years old and that has not been changed from the original manufacturer's specifications.

CUSTOM VEHICLE means a vehicle:

- (a) That is:
 - At least twenty-five (25) years old and of a model year after 1948;
 - 2. Manufactured to resemble a vehicle that is at least twenty-five (25) years old and of a model year after 1948; and
- (b) That:
 - 1. Has been altered from the manufacturer's original design; or
 - 2. Has a body constructed from materials not original to the vehicle.

ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY means any peace officer or code enforcement officer employed by the City of Freeport.

JUNKED VEHICLE A vehicle as defined in Item (9) of Section 621.001 of the Transportation Code that is:

- (1) is self-propelled; and
- (2) is:
 - (A) wrecked, dismantled or partially dismantled, or discarded; or
 - (B) inoperable and has remained inoperable for more than:
 - (i) 72 consecutive hours, if the vehicle is on public property; or
 - (ii) 30 consecutive days, if the vehicle is on private property.
- (b) For purposes of this subchapter, "junked vehicle" includes a motor vehicle, aircraft, or watercraft. This subchapter applies only to:
 - a motor vehicle that displays an expired license plate or does not display a license plate;
 - (2) an aircraft that does not have lawfully printed on the aircraft an unexpired federal aircraft identification number registered under Federal Aviation Administration aircraft registration regulations in 14 C.F.R. Part 47; or
 - (3) a watercraft that:
 - (A) does not have lawfully on board an unexpired certificate of number; and
 - (B) is not a watercraft described by Section 31.055, Parks and Wildlife Code.

Second, Section 94.02 of said Code of Ordinance is hereby amended to add thereto the following:

It is unlawful for a person to maintain, possess, or locate a public nuisance described in this section within the City of Freeport. Provided, however, a person authorized to enforce this chapter may enter private property to examine the junked vehicle or parts of a junked vehicle, to obtain information to identify the junked vehicle or parts of a junked vehicle, to remove or direct the removal of the junked vehicle or parts of a junked vehicle authorized any person to remove a junked vehicle or parts of a junked vehicles from any premises.

Third, Item (B) of Section 94.03 of said Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(B) A request for a hearing must be made not later than the tenth day after the notice was personally delivered, mailed, or placed on the public nuisance. The city manager or his designee shall conduct the public hearing if timely requested by a person described in Division (A) of this section who received a notice required by Division (A) of this section. The hearing shall be held not earlier than the eleventh day after the service of notice required by this Division. At the hearing, the junked vehicle is presumed to be inoperable, unless demonstrated otherwise. The order requiring the removal of the public nuisance must contain a description, license plate number, and identification number of the public nuisance, if available.

Fourth, Division (A) of Section 94.06 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(A) Any peace officer or Code Enforcement Officer or his agent, may enter upon private property for the purposes specified in this chapter to examine vehicles or parts thereof, obtain information as to the identity of vehicles and to remove or cause to be removal of a vehicle or parts of thereof declared to be a nuisance pursuant to this Chapter. The municipal court of the city shall have authority to issue all orders necessary to enforce such Chapter."

Fifth, any person violating the Code of Ordinances of the City of Freeport,
Texas, as amended by this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction therefor assessed a fine as prescribed in Section 10-99 of said Code;
and each day such violation continues and each part of any day any such violation
occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

Sixth, nothing contained in this ordinance shall cause any rights heretofore vested to be altered, affected or impaired in any way and all such rights may be hereafter enforced as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Seventh, this ordinance is cumulative of and in addition to all other ordinances of the City of Freeport, Texas, on the same subject and all such ordinances are hereby expressly saved from repeal. Provided however, where this ordinance and another ordinance conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent regulations or penalties, as the case may be, shall prevail.

Eighth, no offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance is to be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Ninth, in the event any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Tenth, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the descriptive caption of this ordinance has been published twice in the Brazosport Facts.






