According to the Brazoria County Elections Department, our last day to canvass our certified voting records is May 17, 2017, which is in accordance with the State of Texas Election Law statute 67.003, which supersedes our outdated and out of tolerance Charter provision 5.07.

Last day to receive carrier envelopes placed in the mail by 7:00 p.m. on election day, Saturday, May 6, 2017, from voters who are voting outside the United States. (Sec. 86.007(d)(3)).

Friday, May 12, 2017 (6th day after election day)

Deadline for provisional voter to (1) present acceptable identification to county voter registrar, (2) execute an affidavit relating to natural disaster or religious objection in presence of county, or (3) apply for and receive a disability exemption with the voter registrar. (Secs. 65.054(b); 65.0541(a)). The "acceptable form of photo identification" for this procedure is one of the seven listed in the "acceptable forms of photo ID" in note 1. With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the identification must be current or have expired no more than four years before being presented. The forms of supporting identification listed in the "list of the supporting forms of ID that can be presented if the voter does not possess an acceptable form of photo identification, and cannot obtain one due to a reasonable impediment" in note 1 do not apply for this procedure. (Secs. 65.054(b), 65.0541(a); 1 Tex. Admin. Code Sec. 81.71).

Deadline for voter registrar to complete the review of provisional ballots. (1 Tex. Admin. Code Sec. 81.175(a)(1)).

First day that newly-elected officers of Type A general law city may qualify and assume duties of office (per Sec. 22.006, Local Government Code), but see **NOTE**, below.

NOTE: Council members may take office anytime following the canvass. Section 22.006 of the Texas Local Government Code states that a newly-elected municipal officer of a Type A city may exercise the duties of office beginning the fifth day after the date of the election, excluding Sundays. ORDINANCE NO. <u>2017-213</u>7

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, BRAZORIA COUNTY, TEXAS, MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS OF FACT REGARDING AND CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL ELECTION HELD ON THE FIRST SATURDAY IN MAY, 2017, BEING MAY 6, 2017, HELD IN AND THROUGHOUT SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING, FOR A TWO (2) YEAR TERM, A PERSON TO THE OFFICE OF MAYOR OF SAID CITY AND, IN WARDS B AND D OF SAID CITY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING, FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS EACH, PERSONS TO COUNCIL POSITION B AND COUNCIL POSITION D ON THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY; PROVIDING FOR RATIFICATION AND CONFIRMATION OF THE ACTION TAKEN BY THIS ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR OF SAID CITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ORDERED, RESPECTIVELY, BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND MAYOR OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, BRAZORIA COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION ONE--Scope of Ordinance

This ordinance relates to the annual election called by Ordinance No. 2017-2129 of the City of Freeport, Brazoria County, Texas, heretofore read, passed, adopted and ratified on February 6, 2017, by the City Council and Mayor of said City, ordaining and ordering, respectively, that an election be held in and throughout said city on the first Saturday in May, 2017, being May 6, 2017, for the purpose of electing, for a two (2) year term, a person to the office of Mayor of said city and, in Wards B and D of said City, for the purpose of electing to office, for a term of two (2) years each, persons to fill the offices of Council Position B and Council Position D on the City Council of said City.

SECTION TWO--Findings of Fact Regarding Election

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Freeport, Texas, make the following findings of fact with respect to said election, to-wit:

First, that notice of said election was given in the manner and at the time required by law.

Second, that said election was duly called and held in the manner and at the time required by law, and said Ordinance No. 2017-2129, and that only qualified voters were permitted to vote.

Third, that based on the election returns of said election, which are now

before the Mayor and City Council and which are found to be in due form and order and to have been regularly made as required by law, at said election a total of 1,039 votes were cast in the election for mayor, a total of 365 votes were cast in the election for Council Position B and a total of 269 votes were cast in the election for Council Position D.

Fourth, that the following named candidates received the number of votes set opposite their names, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, BRAZORIA COUNTY, TEXAS, CONTAINING A PREAMBLE; CONTAINING FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW; AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY, NOW CODIFIED AS CHAPTER 155 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY TO ADD DEFINITIONS FOR OPEN SPACE AND GREENBELT; RATIFYING AND CONFIRMING ALL ACTIONS PREVIOUSLY TAKEN BY THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF SAID CITY OR THE CITY COUNCIL, OR BOTH; PROVIDING THAT ANY PERSON VIOLATING SAID CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED BY THIS ORDINANCE, SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ASSESSED A FINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 155.999 OF SAID CODE OF ORDINANCE AND THAT EACH DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION CONTINUES SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE; CONTAINING SAVINGS CLAUSES; CONTAINING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER THIS DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED TWICE IN THE BRAZOSPORT FACTS.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas ("the City"), is a "Home Rule City" and a "Home Rule Municipality" lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, as described in and defined by Section 5, Article XI of the Constitution of Texas and Section 1.005 of the Local Government Code of Texas, respectively; and,

WHEREAS, Subchapter A of Chapter 211 of the Local Government Code of Texas and Item (g) of Section 3.07 of the Home Rule Charter of the City authorizes the City Council thereof to adopt the provisions of this Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has determined and does here now declare that the adoption of this ordinance is necessary to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and is necessary to provide clarification of the meanings of "open space" and "greenbelt."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS:

SECTION ONE--Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

The City Council of the City makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law, viz:

First, that the public hearings required by the Zoning Enabling Act of the State of Texas, codified as Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code, and the present Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City, codified as Chapter 155 of the Code of Ordinances of the City, have been conducted in the manner and at the time required.

Second, that not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such hearings, public notice thereof was published once in the Brazosport Facts, a newspaper of general circulation in and the official newspaper of the City, stating the date, time and place of such hearings.

Third, that after considering evidence submitted at such hearings, the City Council of the City is of the opinion and finds that the changes in the comprehensive zoning ordinance of the City set forth below will enable the City Council and the Planning Commission thereof to ---.

Fourth, that the health, safety, morals and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City will best be served by the adoption of this ordinance making the changes in zoning regulations hereinafter mentioned.

SECTION TWO--Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Amended

The Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City of Freeport, Texas, read, passed and approved as Ordinance No. 1100 on the 3rd day of April, 1964, and now codified as Chapter 155 of the Code of Ordinances thereof, hereinafter called "the Zoning Ordinance," is hereby amended as follows:

There is hereby added to Section 155.002 of the Zoning Ordinance, in alphabetical sequence, the following additional definitions:

"Open Space is any open piece of land that is undeveloped (has no buildings or other built structures) and is accessible to the public. Open Space can include: Greenspace (land that is partly or completely covered with grass, trees, shrubs or other vegetation."

"Greenbelt is an open space of landscaped or undeveloped land, usually surrounding a residential area and designated by easement covenant, deed restriction or zoning ordinance that prohibits development (construction of buildings or other elevated structures) in that area."

SECTION THREE--Ratification and Confirmation.

The City Council of the City of Freeport, Texas, hereby ratifies and confirms any and all action taken by the Planning Commission of said City or the City Council of said City, or both, in connection with the change in zoning classification evidenced by this ordinance, including but not limited to the calling of a public hearing required by said Zoning Enabling Act and the Zoning Ordinance, the giving of public notice of such hearings, the giving of written notice to the owners of property which is the subject of such and to the adjoining property owners, the making of preliminary and final reports with respect to such change and the conducting of the public hearings required by said Act and the Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR--Penalty

Any person violating the Zoning Ordinance, as amended by this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefor assessed a fine as prescribed in Section 155.999 of said ordinance; and each day such violation occurs and each day such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION FIVE--Savings Clauses

- (a) Nothing contained in this ordinance shall cause any rights heretofore vested to be altered, affected or impaired in any way and all such rights may be hereafter enforced as if this ordinance had not been adopted.
- (b) This ordinance is cumulative of and in addition to all other ordinances of the City on the same subject and all such ordinances are hereby expressly saved from repeal. Provided however, where this ordinance and another ordinance conflict or overlap, this ordinance shall prevail.
- (c) No offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance is to be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

SECTION SIX--Severance Clause.

In the event any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FIVE--Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the descriptive caption of this ordinance has been published twice in the Brazosport Facts, the official newspaper of the City.

SECTION 3.01 NUMBER, SELECTION AND TERM.

The legislative and governing body of the City of Freeport, Texas, shall be known as "The City Council of the City of Freeport, Texas". Said <u>City Council shall be composed of a Mayor and four (4) council members.</u>

SECTION 3.02. QUALIFICATIONS.

<u>Each member of the City Council shall be</u> a registered voter and a <u>resident citizen of the City of Freeport for at least six (6) months</u> immediately preceding his or her application to have his or her name placed on the official ballot and the filing of proof of his or her qualifications as required by law.
