AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, ADOPTING A WATER CONSERVATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF FREEPORT TO PROMOTE RESPONSIBLE USE OF WATER, AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES AND/OR THE DISCONNECTION OF WATER SERVICE FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE WATER CONSERVATION PLAN AND AMENDING SECTION 52.03 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY TO SO PROVIDE.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas (the "City"), recognizes that the amount of water available to its water customer is limited; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that due to natural limitations, drought conditions, system failures and other acts of God which may occur, the City cannot guarantee an uninterrupted water supply for all purposes at all time; and

WHEREAS, the Water Code and the regulations of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (the "Commission") require that the City adopt a Water Conservation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined an urgent need in the best interest of the public to adopt a Water Conservation Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant the Chapter 54 of the Local Government Code, the City is authorized to adopt such Ordinances necessary to preserve and conserve its water resources; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 1645, read, passed and adopted on October 19, 1987, as amended by Ordinance No. 1863, read, passed and adopted on July 19, 1999, and now codified as Section 52,03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City now desires to adopt the North Texas Municipal Water District (the "NTMWD") Model Water Conservation Plan as official City policy for the conservation of water.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves and adopts the NTMWD Model Water Conservation Plan (the "Plan"), attached hereto as addendum A, as if recited verbatim herein. The City commits to implement the requirements and procedures set forth in the adopted Plan and hereby amends Section 52.03 of the Code of Ordinances of the City to read as follows:

- "(A) The North Texas Municipal Water District Model Water Conservation Plan attached as addendum "A" to the ordinance amending this section is hereby adopted and incorporated herein as if set forth in full at this point. It shall be kept by the City Secretary as a part of such ordinance in the official records of the city.
- (B) Any customer, defined pursuant to 30 Tex. Admin. Code Chapter 291, failing to comply with the provisions of the Plan shall be subject to a fine of up to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) and /or discontinuance of water service by the City. Proof of a culpable mental state is not required for a conviction of an offense under this section. Each day a customer fails to comply with the Plan is a separate violation. The City's authority to seek injunctive or other civil relief available under the law is not limited by this section."

Section 2. The City Council does hereby find and declare that sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting adopting this Ordinance was posted at a designated place convenient to the public for the time required by law preceding the meeting, that such place of posting was readily accessible at all tomes to the general public, and that all of the foregoing was done as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the posting thereof.

Section 3. Should any paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 4. The City Manager or his designee is hereby directed to file a copy of the Plan and this Ordinance with the Commission in accordance with Title 30, Chapter 288 of the Texas Administrative Code.

Section 5. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to cause publication of the descriptive caption of this ordinance as an alternative method of publication provided by law.

Section 6. Ordinance No. 1645, adopted on October 19, 1987, as amended by Ordinance No. 1863, adopted on July 19, 1999, is hereby repealed.

Section 7. No offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance is to be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Ordinance No. 2010 - 2253

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO ILLEGAL WATER CONNECTIONS AND/OR THE THEFT OF WATER RELATED TO THE WATER SUPPLY FOR THE CITY OF FREEPORT, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFOR AND AMENDING SECTION 52.04 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY TO SO PROVIDE.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas (the "City") recognizes that the amount of water available to its water customers is limited; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 54 of the Local Government Code, the City is authorized to adopt such policies necessary to preserve and conserve available water supplies; and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to adopt an ordinance updating the provision of its Code of Ordinances pertaining to illegal water connections and theft of water.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves and adopts this Ordinance as described herein.

Section 2. Section 52.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (A) A person may not knowingly tamper, connect to, or alter any component of the City's water system including valves, meters, meter boxes, lids, hydrants, lines, pump stations, ground storage tanks, and elevated storage tanks. This shall include direct or indirect efforts to initiate or restore water service without the approval of the City.
- (B) If, without the written consent of the City Manger or the City Manger's designee, the person knowingly causes, suffers or allows the initiation or restoration of water service to the property after termination of service(s). For purposes of this section, it shall be assumed that the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property caused, suffered, or allowed the unlawful initiation or restoration of service(s).
- (C) A person may not knowingly make or cause a false report to be made to the City of a reading of water meter installed for metered billing.
- (D) A person commits a separate offense each day that the person performs an act prohibited by this section or fails to perform an act required by this section.
- (E) An offense under this Ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) and/or discontinuance of water service by the City."

Section 3. The City Council does hereby find and declare that sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting considering this Ordinance was posted at a designated place convenient to the public for the time required by law preceding the meeting, that such place of posting was readily accessible at all times to the general public, and that all of the foregoing was done as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance, and the subject matter thereof, has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the posting thereof.

Section 4. Should any paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected.

Section 5. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to cause publication of the descriptive caption of this ordinance as an alternative method of publication provided by law.

Section 6. Ordinance No. 1590, adopted on September 10, 1984, is hereby repealed.

Section 7. No offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance is to be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the descriptive caption of this ordinance has been published twice in the Brazosport Facts, the official newspaper of the City.

Illegal Water Connections and Theft of Water

Municipal Ordinance Pertaining to Water Connections and Theft of Water

Ordinance	No.		

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO ILLEGAL WATER CONNECTIONS AND/OR THE THEFT OF WATER RELATED TO THE WATER SUPPLY FOR THE CITY OF FREEPORT, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFOR AND AMENDING SECTION 52.04 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY TO SO PROVIDE.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas (the "City") recognizes that the amount of water available to its water customers is limited; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 54 of the Local Government Code, the City is authorized to adopt such policies necessary to preserve and conserve available water supplies; and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to adopt an ordinance updating the provision of its Code of Ordinances pertaining to illegal water connections and theft of water.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves and adopts this Ordinance as described herein.

Section 2. Section 52.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (A) A person may not knowingly tamper, connect to, or alter any component of the City's water system including valves, meters, meter boxes, lids, hydrants, lines, pump stations, ground storage tanks, and elevated storage tanks. This shall include direct or indirect efforts to initiate or restore water service without the approval of the City.
- (B) If, without the written consent of the City Manger or the City Manger's designee, the person knowingly causes, suffers or allows the initiation or restoration of water service to the property after termination of service(s). For purposes of this section, it shall be assumed that the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property caused, suffered, or allowed the unlawful initiation or restoration of service(s).
- (C) A person may not knowingly make or cause a false report to be made to the City of a reading of water meter installed for metered billing.
- (D) A person commits a separate offense each day that the person performs an act prohibited by this section or fails to perform an act required by this section.
- (E) An offense under this Ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) and/or discontinuance of water service by the City."

Section 3. The City Council does hereby find and declare that sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting considering this Ordinance was posted at a designated place convenient to the public for the time required by law preceding the meeting, that such place of posting was readily accessible at all times to the general public, and that all of the foregoing was done as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance, and the subject matter thereof, has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the posting thereof.

Re: Request for HOT Funds in support of the 2010 Summertime Blues Festival

Main Street Freeport is requesting \$16,500 in HOT funds in support of the Summertime Blues Festival for 2010. This year's festival will be our sixth, and we expect larger crowds and more activities than ever before. This event has become a much-anticipated and well-respected Freeport tradition, and we want to ensure that tourists and residents who enjoy the festival continue to have a positive experience in our city.

We are budgeting \$10,400 for entertainment on Friday and Saturday and \$3,000 for the stage, sound system, lighting, electrical, DJ and drum kit, with a total need of at least \$13,400. In 2009 the fireworks display cost us \$3000. We have a company willing to provide a fireworks display that rivals Lake Jackson's Fourth of July fireworks spectacle for \$3,000.00 bringing our total entertainment budget to \$16,400.00.

Please keep in mind that these projected expenditures are merely estimates and may vary from final tallies.

In previous years, we have limited our advertizing to city-funds; this year we anticipate an expanded need for promotion. To promote this event properly, we would like to place ads in the Houston Press, Thunder Roads Texas, the Chronicle, Thunder Press and several other publications. We have approximately \$175.00 remaining in our city advertizing budget going into the festival season, so we estimate a need for at least \$6,000 in additional revenue for advertising and promotion. As always, we will make use of any free website, event calendar, television and newspaper placement we can find.

With entertainment and fireworks, we expect to spend at least \$16,400 for this event. This does not include the triathlon breakfast, generator rental or other incidentals. We hope that much of this can still be acquired through in-kind donations from local industry. Furthermore, we hope to raise at least \$3,000 in vendor fees.

HOT funds may legally be used for a live music or cultural event, so we request \$10,000 to go toward live entertainment at the festival. HOT funds may also be used to advertise and promote a city, so we are requesting \$6,000 for that as well, bringing our total request to \$16,400.

We will be happy to sit down and discuss our needs further if you require. Please see addendum for reference on cost breakdowns.
