LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

David Thrash was attending the TLA Conference. Natalie McAdams stated that:

The City of Freeport is paying for 40 loaned books from McNaughton. All branches within the Brazoria County Library System received one (1) IPAD mini

There will be a Social Security express link on the library homepage. Different government assists programs and one financial planning link. There will be a United Way database presentation on June 2nd in Pearland. Library Reads link will be on home page. Ten different books for month will be available based on national book list.

Job View – job locating service. An advantage to this link is that it will list whether or not you can apply for the job if you have been incarcerated. Game of Tomes – Write poetry by grouping various book titles together. Gulf Coast Reads – "Remember Ben Clayton". A book commissioned by his father on sculpture, clay and horse classes.

Hoopla – Movie/tv/audio book svc/cds. Click on the link on the library site and go straight to Hoopla link. Allowed 21 days for books and 3 days for movies.

Learn for Life – a website where you can take online classes for free. Certificates are issued upon completion of class. These are actual college classes.

Total circulation improved by 177 but this is more renewals than checking out. Freeport Library is the 3rd busiest as far as computer usage is concerned: Pearland and Pearland West are busier.

Friends of the Freeport Library and the Library boards will be looking grants to be applied to the cost of a new building for the Library. There was discussion about the Library moving into the old Texas Bank building downtown but City Hall may be moving into that building. City of Freeport is considering selling the current city hall building to Port Freeport.

The meeting adjourned at 6:00 p.m. Date for next meeting is July 8th at 4:45 pm.
